Annotated Bibliography

(MLA format)

Author's last name, First name. Book title. Publisher, date (year).

(Example)

Zubrin, Robert J. Entering Space: Creating a Spacefaring Civilization. Tarcher/Putnam, 1999. (notice that the second line is indented, not the first)

Summary:

Write a three-paragraph **summary** (including beginning, middle, and ending of story) of what happened in the book. These paragraphs need to be clear and thorough. Make sure you include quotes to illustrate what you discuss. For example, use a quote that illustrates a characteristic of the main character or a quote to explain the setting of the story. **No more than 300 words.**

Review:

Write one thorough paragraph on why you liked or did not like the book. **Please be specific.** Discuss specific details from the literary work. Avoid generalizations like: "This was the best book I ever read." Or, "I give this book four out of five stars!" **This must be at least five sentences and about 100 words long.**

Note to writer:

The format for the annotated bibliography **MUST BE EXACTLY** like this example. All annotated bibliographies must be **TYPED**. If the form is not correct, you will not get full credit for your independent reading. This is worth 50 points (test grade) toward your Literature grade.
